



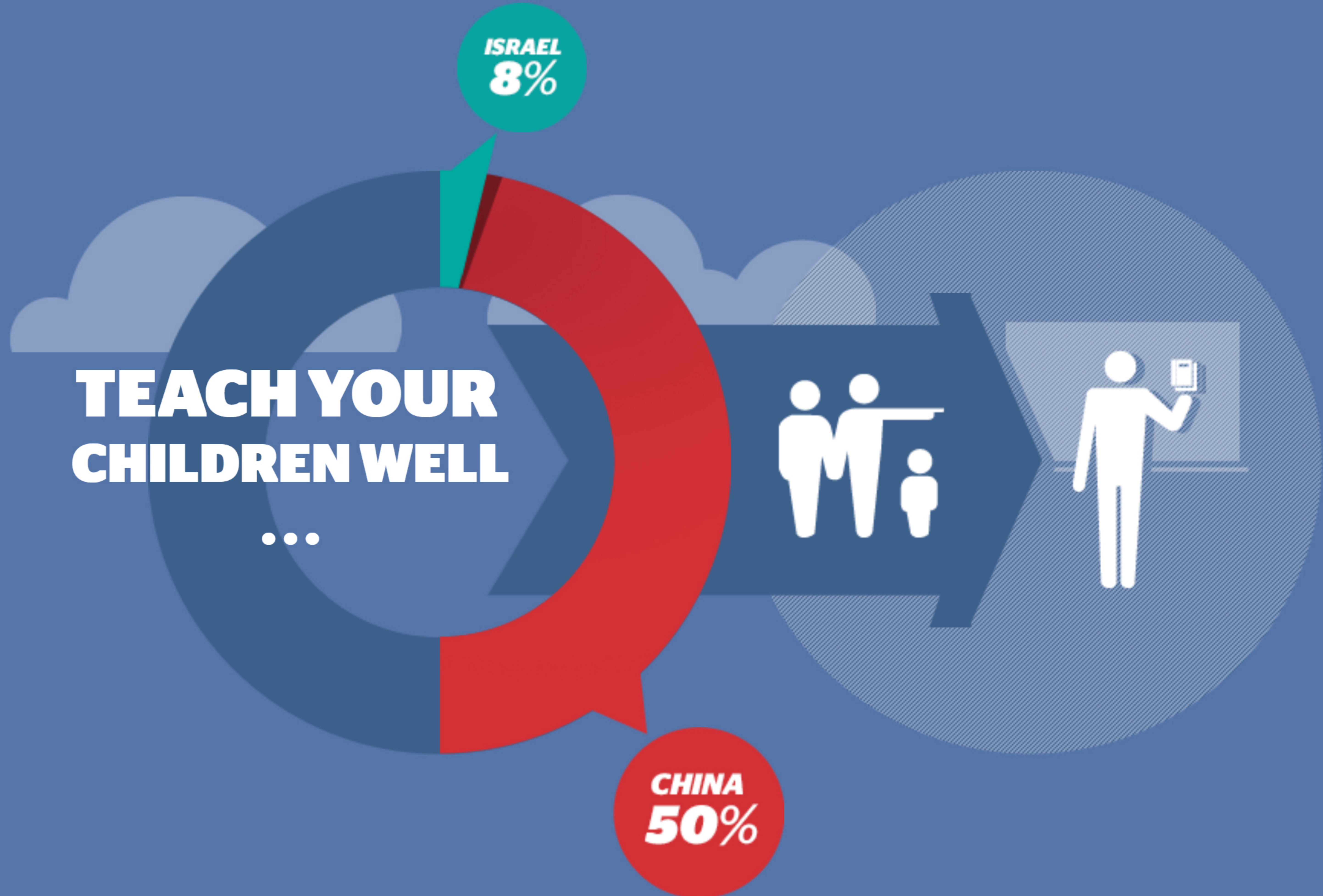

A TEACHER IS LIKE A



In the majority of countries surveyed (for example, New Zealand, Spain and the Netherlands), teachers are considered similar to social workers in terms of their profession. In China they are considered most like doctors, in France and Turkey, they are considered to be most like nurses, and in the USA, most like librarians.



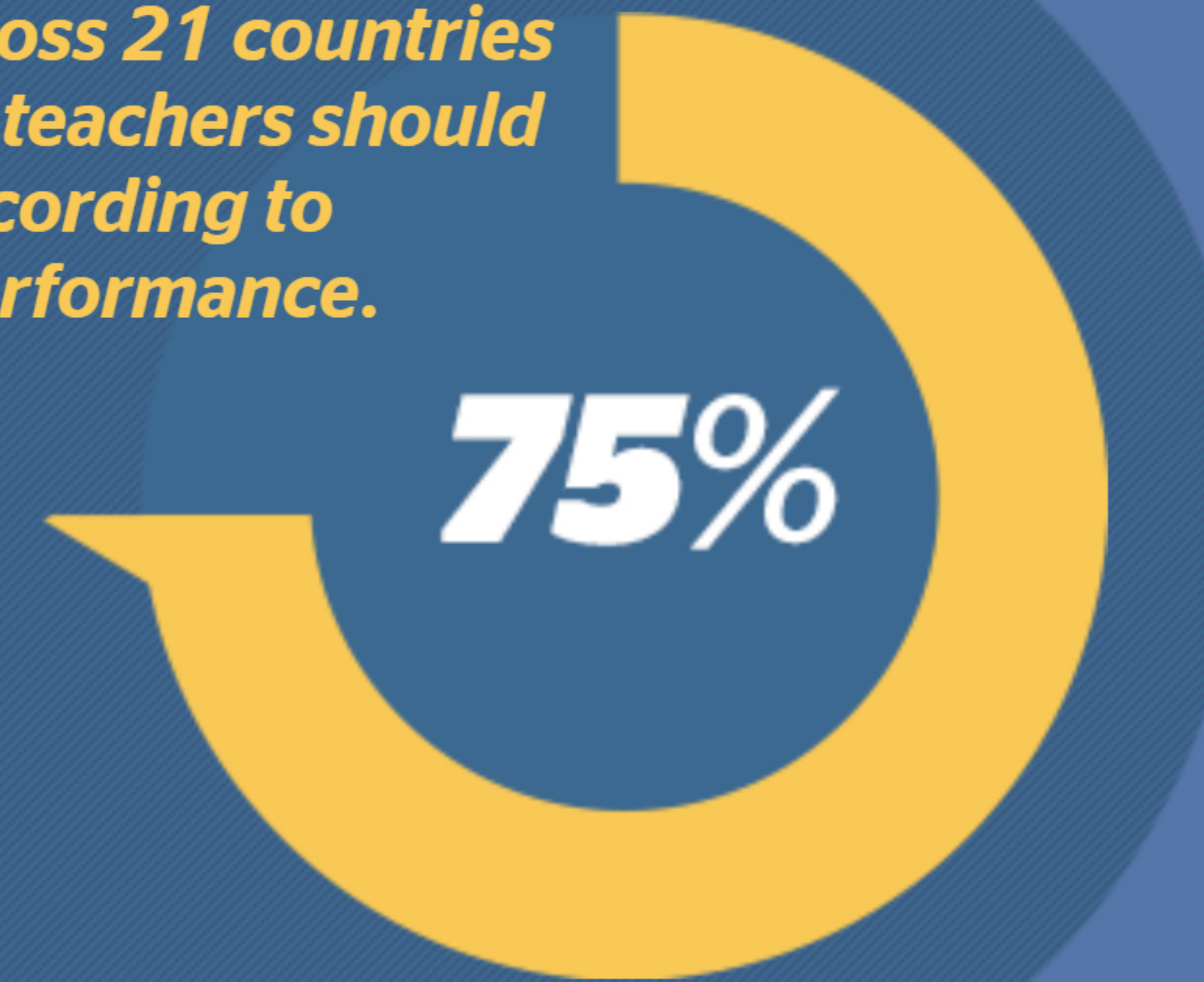
In China, 50% of those surveyed would definitely encourage their children to become teachers. In Israel, only 8% would.

ARE TEACHERS PAID ENOUGH?

In South Korea, France and the US, teachers are paid significantly more than people think they get paid or think they deserve.



An average of 75% of people across 21 countries agree that teachers should be paid according to student performance.



There is a clear and positive relationship between teacher relative pay and performance. In most countries, people think teachers should be paid more. In South Korea, France and the US, teachers are paid significantly more than people think they **do** get paid or **should** get paid.
